



## INTRODUCTION

Cwmaman Town Council recognises its statutory duty under Section 6 of the Environment (Wales) Act 2016 to maintain and enhance biodiversity and promote the resilience of ecosystems in exercising its functions. This duty aligns with the broader objectives of the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, supporting a more resilient and healthier Wales.

This report outlines the actions taken by the Council between April 2022 and March 2025 to meet this duty. It highlights both strategic and practical efforts to embed biodiversity into decision-making, land management, community engagement, and partnership working.

The Council serves a semi-rural community in south Wales, encompassing diverse habitats such as heathland, woodland, rivers, and meadows, which support key species including the swift, otter, marsh fritillary butterfly and dormouse. Cwmaman Town Council is committed to protecting these natural assets for the benefit of future generations.

This report will be submitted to One Voice Wales and made publicly available, reflecting our commitment to transparency, local accountability, and continual improvement in biodiversity practice.

# WELCOME

From Kevin Madge, Parks, Assets and Environment Committee chair.

# BACKGROUND

The Environment (Wales) Act 2016 places a legal duty on all public bodies, including Cwmaman Town Council, to seek to maintain and enhance biodiversity and, in doing so, promote the resilience of ecosystems. This requirement sits alongside the Council's wider responsibilities under the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, which aims to ensure that decisions taken today meet the needs of future generations and contribute to a healthier, more resilient, and cohesive Wales.

Cwmaman Town Council is committed to meeting its environmental responsibilities in a way that is both achievable and meaningful for our community.

We actively work with local partners including Initiative for Conservation Cymru (INCC), our local school, volunteers, and the wider community to support biodiversity and ecological wellbeing. We believe small, practical actions — such as creating wildflower areas, installing bird boxes, supporting pollinator planting, and encouraging litter picking — can collectively make a meaningful contribution to environmental resilience.

In line with our duties, Cwmaman Town Council is committed to:

- Considering biodiversity in decision-making, procurement and planning responses.
- Minimising environmental impact through efficient use of resources and reducing herbicide use.
- Supporting community-led action, education and awareness-raising on nature and sustainability.
- Restoring and creating habitats where possible, such as wildflower verges and community orchards.
- Partnering with others, including statutory bodies, environmental charities and schools.
- Monitoring progress and reviewing this plan regularly to adapt and improve.

We recognise that our role can have real influence through our leadership and community voice. We are committed to passing on a healthier natural environment to future generations of Cwmaman residents, and embedding environmental responsibility across all areas of our work.

#### THE BIODIVERSITY AND RESILIENCE OF ECOSYSTEMS DUTY REPORT 2025

Cwmaman Town Council serves the community of Cwmaman in Carmarthenshire, embracing the neighbouring villages of Glanamman and Garnant in the Amman Valley. The Council's precept for 2025/26 was £395,794, and for 2024/25 it was £359,930.31. The Council is comprised of 15 Councillors supported by a team of 6 staff.

The Council manages a range of community assets including 11 parks and green spaces, public planters and hanging baskets, bus shelters and 5 community buildings. These assets provide important opportunities for access to green space, nature engagement and community activity.

The landscape of Cwmaman features diverse and valuable habitats including marshy grassland, heathland, meadow, rivers, broadleaf woodland and upland oak woodland. The River Amman runs through the area and a 7-mile traffic-free riverside cycle and walking path provides recreational access and links key natural areas. Parc Golwg yr Aman, situated alongside this path and developed on the former site of the tinplate works, offers extensive green space with informal trails and a species-rich wildflower meadow at its heart. Work at Golwg yr Aman has been supported by local partners to enhance habitat diversity and public enjoyment of the riverside landscape. Nearby Gelli Werdd Park, reclaimed from former industrial land, offers additional natural open space for residents and visitors, enhancing the local green network. The Cwmaman area is also home to INCC (Initiative for Nature Conservation Cymru), a local charity working closely with the Council and community volunteers on habitat restoration, species monitoring and biodiversity engagement projects.

The community supports a rich array of wildlife, including species such as pied flycatcher, cuckoo, swift, marsh fritillary butterfly, willow tit, dormouse, otter and salmon, which benefit from the mosaic of grassland, woodland and river habitats.

The Council has objected to applications likely to harm habitats or species, with biodiversity impacts forming part of its decision-making rationale.</p> <p><b>Tender Processes:</b> Biodiversity considerations have been included in tender documents. Scoring frameworks for recent tenders have incorporated environmental impact as a formal evaluation criterion.</p> <p><b>Policy References:</b> Biodiversity is referenced in relevant Council policies, reinforcing its role as a factor in operational and strategic decisions. These steps demonstrate the Council's commitment to factoring biodiversity into its routine decision-making, even in the absence of a formal strategy during this period.</p>	Clerk/RFO/ Assets, Parks and Environment Committee

These include:</p> <p><b>Meadow Management at Golwg yr Aman:</b> The Council maintains a wildflower meadow within this key park, supporting pollinators and enhancing biodiversity within a public green space.</p> <p><b>Community Orchard:</b> Planted and managed a community orchard, adding to local tree cover and providing habitat for a range of species.</p> <p><b>Wildflower and Pollinator Planting:</b> Planted native and pollinator-friendly flowers in planters, verges, and parks. Early spring bulbs were planted to extend nectar availability.</p> <p><b>Tree Planting with Local Schools:</b> Supported schools in planting native trees on their grounds, increasing connectivity between habitats.</p> <p><b>Nest Box Installation:</b> House martin boxes were installed at the community centre to encourage local breeding populations of these declining birds.</p> <p><b>Support for INCC Projects:</b> The Council provided support for the Initiative for Nature Conservation Cymru (INCC), who led biodiversity projects within the community including creation of ponds, wildlife gardens, and propagation of wildflower and pollinator plants for community use.</p> <p><b>Invasive Species Management:</b> Tackled Japanese knotweed in targeted locations to protect native species and reduce habitat degradation.</p> <p>Through these actions, Cwmaman Town Council has helped expand and connect habitats within the community, contributing to stronger local ecological networks.</p>	Clerk/RFO/ Assets, Parks and Environment Committee

This invasive species threatens native biodiversity and requires targeted treatment to prevent spread.</p> <p><b>Chemical-Free Cleaning Methods:</b> Park and facility cleaning services engaged by the Council use steam and water only – avoiding broad-spectrum herbicides and chemical cleaners – reducing pollution and safeguarding soil and water health.</p> <p><b>Transition from Herbicides:</b> The Council has reduced or eliminated the use of chemical herbicides across public spaces, especially in areas managed for biodiversity.</p> <p><b>Support for Local Monitoring Efforts:</b> Initial discussions were held with community partners (e.g. WAWR) to explore air and water quality monitoring within the area, supporting evidence-led environmental improvement.</p> <p><b>Habitat as Pollution Buffer:</b> Meadow areas and wildflower plantings managed or supported by the Council help absorb rainwater, reduce runoff, and act as natural filters for localised pollution.</p>	Clerk/RFO/ Assets, Parks and Environment Committee

**Cwmaman Town Council serves a thriving community in the County of Carmarthenshire, in south-west Wales. The Council covers a semi-rural area rich in natural habitats, including upland oak woodland, heathland, meadows, rivers, and broadleaf woodland. These support important species such as the swift, dormouse, marsh fritillary butterfly, willow tit, and otter.**



**As a community-level public body, Cwmaman Town Council plays an important role in supporting biodiversity through its functions. These include the management of parks and public open spaces, coordination of local nature initiatives, delivery of environmental education activities with schools and residents, and influence over local planning decisions. The Council also provides practical and financial support for community-led projects that enhance biodiversity and raise environmental awareness.**

**The Council manages 11 parks and green spaces, alongside community buildings, planters, and public amenities. With a precept of £395,794 for 2025/26 and operating within the framework of the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, Cwmaman Town Council contributes to the national goal of a resilient and biodiverse Wales.**

**This Biodiversity Action Plan outlines our planned priorities and actions for 2025 to 2028, structured around the objectives of the Nature Recovery Action Plan for Wales and fulfilling our obligations under the Environment (Wales) Act 2016.**


