### 1. Expenditure under \$137 Local Government Act 1972

Section 137(1) of the 1972 Act permits the Council to spend on activities for which it has no other specific powers if the Council considers that the expenditure is in the interests of, and will bring direct benefit to, the area or any part of it, or all or some of its inhabitants, providing that the benefit is commensurate with the expenditure. Section 137(3) also permits the Council to incur expenditure for certain charitable and other purposes. The maximum expenditure that can be incurred under both section 137(1) and (3) for the financial year 2024-25 was £10.81 per elector.

In 2024-25, the Council made payments totalling £1916.50 under section 137. These payments are included within 'Other payments' in the Accounting Statement.

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#### Explanation of Significant Increase in Asset Register Value

The Council has undertaken a full review of its asset register during the year to ensure it provides a more complete and accurate record of council-owned buildings, fixed assets, and equipment. This review included updating valuations to reflect current replacement or insurance values, and the inclusion of previously omitted items. This process is ongoing to ensure the register remains representative of the Council's true asset base.
